CCWG 2nd DRAFT PROPOSAL

Section 1. MISSION

The Mission of The Internet Corporation for Assigned Names and Numbers ("ICANN") is to coordinate, at the overall level, the global Internet's systems of unique identifiers, and in particular to ensure the stable and secure operation of the Internet's unique identifier systems. In particular, ICANN:

- 1. Coordinates the allocation and assignment of the three sets of unique identifiers for the Internet, which are
- a. Domain names (forming a system referred to as "DNS");
- b. Internet protocol ("IP") addresses and autonomous system ("AS") numbers; and
- c. Protocol port and parameter numbers.
- 3. Coordinates policy development reasonably and appropriately related to these technical functions.
- In this role, with respect to domain names, ICANN's Mission is to coordinate the development and implementation of policies:
- For which uniform or coordinated resolution is reasonably necessary to facilitate the openness, interoperability, resilience, security and/or stability of the DNS; and
- That are developed through a bottom-up, consensus-based multistakeholder process and designed to ensure the stable and secure operation of the Internet's unique names systems.
- In this role, with respect to IP addresses and AS numbers, ICANN's Mission is described in the ASO MoU between ICANN and RIRs.
- In this role, with respect to protocol port and parameter numbers, ICANN's Mission is to [to be provided by the IETF].
- In this role, with respect to the DNS root server system, ICANN's

ICANN shall have no power to act other than in accordance with, and as reasonably appropriate to achieve its Mission.

Without in any way limiting the foregoing absolute prohibition, ICANN shall not engage in or use its powers to attempt the regulate services that use the Internet's unique identifiers, or the content that they such services carry or provide.

* clarify that final legal language should ensure ICANN has authority to enforce (i) voluntary TLD applicant commitments and (ii) Consensus Policy as defined in Specification 1.

Section 2. COMMITMENTS & CORE VALUES

In carrying out its Mission, ICANN will act in a manner that complies with and reflects ICANN's Commitments and respects ICANN's Core Values, both described below.

COMMITMENTS

- 1. In performing its Mission, ICANN must operate in a manner consistent with its Bylaws for the benefit of the Internet community as a whole, carrying out its activities in conformity with relevant principles of international law and international conventions, and applicable local law and through open and transparent processes that enable competition and open entry in Internet-related markets. Specifically, ICANN's action must:
- 2. Preserve and enhance the neutral and judgment free operation of the DNS, and the operational stability, reliability, security, global interoperability, resilience, and openness of the DNS and the Internet;
- 3. Maintain the capacity and ability to coordinate the DNS at the overall level and to work for the maintenance of a single, interoperable Internet;
- 4. Respect the creativity, innovation, and flow of information made possible by the Internet by limiting ICANN's activities to matters that are within ICANN's Mission and require or significantly benefit from global coordination;
- 5. Employ open, transparent and bottom-up, multistakeholder policy development processes, led by the private sector, including business stakeholders, civil society, the technical community, and academia, and end users that (i) seek input from the public, for whose benefit ICANN shall in all events act, (ii) promote well-informed decisions based on expert advice, and (iii) ensure that

While remaining rooted in the private sector, including business stakeholders, civil society, the technical community, and academia, and end users, recognizing that governments and public authorities are responsible for public policy and duly taking into account the public policy advice of governments and public authorities. Striving to achieve a reasonable balance between the interests of different stakeholders. These <u>Commitments and Core Values</u> are <u>intended to apply</u> in the broadest possible range of circumstances. The specific way in which Core Values apply, individually and collectively, to each new situation <u>may</u> depend on many factors that cannot be fully anticipated or enumerated. Situations may arise in which perfect fidelity to all <u>Core Values</u> simultaneously is not possible. In any situation where one Core Value must be reconciled with another, potentially competing Core Value, the balancing must further an important public interest goal within ICANN's Mission that is identified through the bottom-up, multistakeholder process.
