<p>ICANN shall have no power to act strictly other than in accordance with, and only as reasonably appropriate to achieve its Mission.</p> <p>Without in any way limiting the foregoing absolute prohibition, ICANN shall not regulate services that use the Internet's unique identifiers, or the content that such services carry or provide.</p> <p>In service of its Mission ICANN shall have the ability to enforce agreements with contracted parties, subject to established means of community input on those agreements and reasonable checks and balances on its ability to impose obligations exceeding ICANN's Mission on registries and registrars.</p>	<p>ICANN shall act strictly in accordance with, and only as reasonably appropriate to achieve its Mission.</p> <p>Alt. 1 (A. Sullivan): ICANN shall not impose regulations on services (i.e., any software process that accepts connections from the Internet) that use the Internet's unique identifiers, or the content that such services carry or provide</p> <p>Alt 2 (Shatan/Mueller/Bladel): ICANN shall not impose regulations on information services [(i.e., any software process that accepts connects from the Internet)] that use the Internet's unique identifiers [other than those covered by the Registrar Accreditation Agreement (RAA) or the Registry Agreement (RA)] or the content that such information services carry or provide</p> <p>ICANN shall have the ability to negotiate, enter into and enforce agreements with contracted parties in service of its Mission.</p> <p>Milton Mueller Alt (not discussed last week): ICANN shall have the ability to negotiate, enter into and enforce agreements with contracted parties insofar as those agreements are consistent with its Mission.</p>
