George Kirikos:Isn't that a major problem for fairness to domain name registrants, if they have no access to the courts?

George Kirikos:No in person hearings, no cross-examination, no discovery --- all the due process mechanisms in the courts, unavailable to the domain owner.

David Taylor:If these were available it would not be a cost efficient process for both claimant and respondent.

George Kirikos:@David: when the stakes are high enough (e.g. short domain names, single word domain names), taking short-cuts to due process that leads to incorrect decisions is a false economy.

David Taylor:agree if it leads to an incorrect decision. No one wants those

George Kirikos:Thanks Nick.
