ICANN Board	The Board receives the relevant papers for items on their agenda, and in the agenda setting process, items are identified as likely to be decided through the consent agenda basis	Any items that are identified as likely to be decided through the consent agenda basis	Once the full Board has an opportunity to review all items on the consent agenda – and up through the time of voting on the consent agenda, any member of the Board may request that an item comes off the consent agenda and be placed on the main agenda for broader discussion.	A single vote is then called for all items remaining on the consent agenda. Typically, all votes are in favor of the consent agenda.	
Interim Process used by GNSO Council		Items not requiring a motion.	The Chair or meeting leader calls for any opposition to said item being in the consent agenda. If any opposition is voiced, then that item is dropped from the consent agenda (and can be re-introduced at any time in the main agenda).	If no opposition is voiced to the item being on the consent agenda, the Chair or meeting leader calls for any opposition to the item itself. If any opposition is voiced, then no action is taken (and the item can be re-introduced at any time in the main agenda).
