Jorge Cancio (GAC Switzerland): I don't think the summary of comment 1 is ok

Steve Chan: Javier, hand up for just a quick contextual comment whenever there is a break

Jorge Cancio (GAC Switzerland): the concerns are on the "intended use" rule and any extension of it - the concerns do NOT affect the "non-objection" rule

Jorge Cancio (GAC Switzerland):those inputs are quite clear: "In the case of non-capital city names the rule according to which the "non-objection" framework is not applicable when the alleged "intended use" is non-geographic should be suppressed as it ignores the unique character of the TLDs and creates wrong incen-tives to circumvent (i.e. "game") the requirement to contact and obtain the non-objection from the relevant public authorities. Accordingly, we also disagree with any proposals that suggest to extend the "intend-ed use" rule to any other categories of geonames. "

Jeff Neuman (Overall SubPro Co-chair):@christopher - can you point to evidence that the US is an outlier

John Rodriguez: The US stands by its comments. Appreciate the opportunity to share its perspective in this process.

Annebeth Lange, co-lead ccNSO: The comment period was quite long and everybody had the opportunity to send in their comments. So now, as Martin said, the most important is to see if we have captured the comments correctly.

Martin Sutton (Co-Lead):@John - thank you. It was good to see comments provided from different governments, which are very welcome.

Annebeth Lange, co-lead ccNSO:The text in blue, who has written that?

Steve Chan:For clarity, in the Supplemental Initial Report, the header for section f.1.2.1 states: Who owns a string? Who has rights to a string? What is the appropriate role of geographic communities and governments?

Steve Chan: I believe that is what APTLD is referring to rather than Question 1 in this section.

Steve Chan:@Annebeth, the text in blue is primarily a quote of the text I just provided here in AC chat. Cheryl Langdon-Orr (CLO - PDP Co-Chair):The points raised re 1591 can be well discussed when this goes to the full WG (it is not so mush a "new Idea" as such but rather an important distinction regarding the delegation and management of a TLD as difned by RFC1591

Jorge Cancio (GAC Switzerland): I feel that on the definition question it should be understood that the line of comments coming from Switzerland etc. support the 2012 categories, although with the caveat that additional geonames should be covered

Jorge Cancio (GAC Switzerland): the summary should be amended as before...

Steve Chan:@Jorge, on top of it!

Martin Sutton (Co-Lead):@ Jorge - note your point but is that captured in the notes "for non-AGB terms, extend non-objection provision

Christopher Wilkinson: The INTA position is too restrictive: there are thousands of geographical names that would be excluxed on that basis.

Jorge Cancio (GAC Switzerland): I feel the lists are interesting and useful for those geonames not explicitly covered by the 2012 categories - they could be used by an Advisory Geographic Names Panel... Jorge Cancio (GAC Switzerland): the RrSG suggestion mixes definition with _"intended use"... not very useful...

Cheryl Langdon-Orr (CLO - PDP Co-Chair): We are at Line 34 of the GDoc and bottom of page 6 in the AC room

Cheryl Langdon-Orr (CLO - PDP Co-Chair):now top of page 11 in the AC room

Steve Chan:Note, staff has generally not pulled the Concerns, New Ideas into the summary. The expectation is that those elements will be considered substantively during WT5 deliberations, after this comment review/sorting exercise.

Annebeth Lange, co-lead ccNSO:Thanks, Steve, that is clarifying.
