# Outcomes of prior meeting (#116)

---

- **The COR policy should be reduced to notifications only, with no COR transfer lock**
- **Notifications should be mandatory (opt-out option TBD)**
- **“Change of Registrant” should be replaced with “Change of Registrant Data” (definition TBD)**

# Mandatory Notifications

**Recap: The WG has discussed that the notification must include the following elements:**

- **Domain name(s)**
- **Text stating that the contact information was updated**
- **Date and time that the Change of Registrant [Data] was completed**
- **Instructions detailing how the [Prior/New] Registrant can take action if the change was invalid (how to initiate a reversal)**

**This notification would be sent every time there is a change to “Registrant Data”**

# Notifications - Opt Out

## Should registrants be able to opt out of notifications when their data changes?

Pros and Cons we have heard so far from the WG:

<b>PROs</b>	<b>CONs</b>
Provides middle path between mandatory and optional notifications (more flexibility)	Non-uniform implementation/user experience across registrars
Reduces incoming emails, SMS messages, etc. which registrants may consider spam	Potential Registrant confusion/frustration due to differing options across registrars
May be useful to registrants who enable a Registry lock (serverUpdateProhibited EPP status code)	Bad Actor may opt-out so true registrant does not receive notifications (reduced security)
	Opt-out may be made default by terms & conditions, Registrar, or Designated Agent
	Registrants may opt-out without knowing the consequences
	More coding and costly to develop opt-out feature

# Change of Registrant Data - Definitions

# Change of Registrant Data (CORD)

“**Change of Registrant Data**” = a Material Change to any of the following Registrant Data fields: [to be agreed by WG].

Registrant	Name	Organization	Email Address	Phone Number	Fax Number (if available)	Postal Address	Other
<b>Change of Registrant</b>	✓	✓	✓				✓ <del>Admin Contact Email (if no Registrant Email)</del>
<b>Change of Registrant Data</b>	✓	✓	✓	✓	✓	✓	

Possible Footnote: The Registrar is not prevented from sending additional notifications resulting from non-CORD changes, such as changes to [Account Holder details or other information used to identify controllership of the domain name or relevant account].



# Change of Registrant Data - Material Change

---

(II.A.1.3) “**Material Change**” = a change which is not a typographical correction. (Name, Org, Email)

- Nothing prevents a Registrar from treating any change to [\[registrant data\]](#) as a Material Change.

Which of the following examples would you consider a **typographical correction** (NOT a Material Change)?

1. Changing the Registrant Name from oJhn Smith to John Smith.
2. Changing the Registrant Organization from ExampleCorp. to Example Corp.
3. Changing the Registrant Email Address from [johnsmith@example.com](mailto:johnsmith@example.com) to [ojhnsmith@example.com](mailto:ojhnsmith@example.com)
4. Changing the Registrant Phone Number from (555)555-5551 to (555)555-5552
5. Changing the Registrant Postal Address from 515 Example Drive to 514 Example Drive
6. Changing the Registrant Postal Address from 515 Example Drive to 515 Example Dr

- Does the addition of Registrant Data where there was none before (e.g. fax) count as a CORD?

# Change of Registrant Data - Privacy/Proxy/Designated Agent

---

## When using a Privacy/Proxy service or Designated Agent:

- **CORD** ≠ the addition, removal, and/or update of Privacy/Proxy Service provider information or Designated Agent information
- **CORD** = changes to the Registered Name Holder's underlying registration data on file with the Registrar, regardless of whether such data is present in public RDDS.

# Change of Registrant Data - Prior and New Registrant

---

(II.A.1.4) **"Prior Registrant"** = the Registered Name Holder at the time a Change of Registrant is initiated

(II.A.1.5) **"New Registrant"** = the entity or person to whom the Prior Registrant proposes to transfer its domain name registration

**Are both terms/definitions still relevant in a "Change of Registrant Data" policy?**

E.g.

**Prelim Rec 1: The Working Group recommends that following a Change of Registrant, the Registrar **MUST** send a notification of the change to both the Prior Registrant (as listed in the Registration Data immediately prior to the Change of Registrant) and the New Registrant. Additionally, the Registrar **MUST** send this notification without undue delay, but no later than 24 hours after the Change of Registrant occurred.**

# Change of Registrant Data - ~~Prior and New Registrant~~

---

**(Revised) Prelim Rec 1:** The Working Group recommends that, following a Change of Registrant **Data**, the Registrar **MUST** send a notification of the Change of Registrant **Data** to ~~both the Prior Registrant (as listed in the Registration Data immediately prior to the Change of Registrant) and the New Registrant.~~ **Additionally, the Registrar MUST send this notification** without undue delay, but no later than 24 hours after the Change of Registrant **Data** occurred.

- **When must a Registrar send two CORD notifications?**
  - e.g. change of email – notification sent to prior email address and new email address?
    - change of phone, fax, and/or postal address?

# Availability of Change of Registrant [Data]

## TRANSFER POLICY: II. Inter-Registrant Transfer (Change of Registrant)

---

### B. Availability of Change of Registrant

- (1) In general, registrants must be permitted to update their Registration Data and transfer their registration rights to other registrants freely.
- (2) A Registrar **MUST deny** a COR request under the following circumstances:
  - 2.1 the domain name registration agreement has expired
  - 2.2 the COR was not properly authorized by Prior Registrant ~~and the New Registrant~~
  - 2.3 the domain name is subject to a domain name related dispute (UDRP, URS, UDRP, or court order)
- (3) The COR process **does not apply** in the following circumstances:
  - 3.1 the registration agreement expires
  - 3.2 the registration agreement is terminated by the Registrar
  - 3.3 the Registrar or Registry Operator updates the Prior Registrant's information pursuant to a court order
  - 3.4 the Registrar updates the Prior Registrant's information in the implementation of a UDRP decision
  - 3.5 the Registrar updates the Prior Registrant's information in accordance with the Expired Domain Deletion Policy
  - 3.6 the Registrar updates the Prior Registrant's information in response to an abuse complaint
