



**Amendment One
to the .Pharmacy Registry-Registrar Agreement between
EnCirca, Inc. and National Association of Boards of Pharmacy**

This Amendment One, which is effective, nunc pro tunc, on September 1, 2015 is executed between EnCirca, Inc. (“Registrar”) and the National Association of Boards of Pharmacy (“NABP” or “Registry Operator”), collectively “Parties,” and amends the .Pharmacy Registry-Registrar Agreement between Registrar and NABP effective November 11, 2014 (the “Agreement”).

WHEREAS, NABP and Registrar entered into a Registry-Registrar Agreement on November 11, 2014; and

WHEREAS, the Parties wish to amend the Agreement to revise a portion of Exhibit D, replace Exhibit E and revise a portion of Exhibit H;

NOW THEREFORE, the Parties agree that for good and valuable consideration the Agreement is amended as follows:

1. Exhibit D, Registry Operator's Operational Standards, Policies, Procedures and Practices, section V Domain Name Renewal is deleted in its entirety and replaced in its entirety with the attached section V Domain Name Renewal.
2. Exhibit E, Registration Fees is deleted in its entirety and replaced in its entirety with the attached Exhibit E, Registration Fees.
3. Exhibit H, section 5. General Availability, paragraph two is deleted in its entirety and replaced with the following paragraph:
“During General Availability there are seven pricing tiers for registration of domain names. These tiers and corresponding registration fees and maximum resale prices are identified in Exhibit E. The domain names corresponding to the various price tiers are available to Registrar from the Registry Service Provider.”

Except as provided in this Amendment One, all terms and conditions of the above referenced Agreement, as amended, shall remain in force and effect.

IN WITNESS THEREOF, this Amendment One has been executed by a duly authorized representative of each organization that is a Party to the Agreement.

Exhibit D
Registry Operator's Operational Standards, Policies, Procedures and Practices

V. Domain Name Renewal

Below is a chart indicating the time table for the annual renewal of .pharmacy domain(s) each successive year during which the domain(s) is active.

<u>Time frame</u>	<u>ReApplication Status</u>	<u>Effect</u>
120 days prior to the Anniversary Date*	Registrar will advise Customer to timely complete the annual .pharmacy TLD Program reapplication form, found at www.safe.pharmacy/apply or successor site(s) and timely pay the \$2000 reapplication fee. Registrar will inform Customer that if the reapplication and payment are not timely received, Customer may risk Suspension and/or Deletion of the .pharmacy domain(s).	Any time prior to the Anniversary Date, Registrar may renew the .pharmacy domain(s) for a one year term and collect the applicable registration fee.
90-30 days prior to the Anniversary Date	Customer has not reapplied for the .pharmacy TLD Program.	NABP may advise Customer that the .pharmacy re-application must be processed and approved prior to the Anniversary Date to avoid the Suspension* and/or Deletion* of the .pharmacy domain(s). NABP may further advise Customer that submission of the reapplication 5 or less days before the Anniversary Date may result in domain Suspension, which decision is at the sole discretion of NABP.
5 days to 1 day prior to the Anniversary Date	Customer has not reapplied for the .pharmacy TLD Program or NABP receives re-application	If the reapplication is received between five days and one day prior to the Anniversary Date, NABP may, in its sole discretion, after the Anniversary Date has passed, suspend the domain(s) pending NABP's review and approval of Customer's reapplication. If NABP suspends the domain(s), NABP will notify the Customer and Registrar that the .pharmacy domain(s) is suspended pending NABP's review and approval of Customer's application.

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Anniversary Date	Customer has not reapplied for the .pharmacy TLD program or NABP receives re-application.	NABP will suspend the domain(s) pending NABP's applicable receipt and approval of Customer's re-application. NABP will send a notice of the suspension and impending Deletion to the Customer and Registrar.
Redemption Grace Period (RGP)*	Customer has not reapplied for the .pharmacy TLD program within the RGP.	The domain(s) will be deleted by NABP and placed into the general pool of .pharmacy domains. If the .pharmacy domain(s) had been renewed, no registration fee collected by the Registrar will be refunded.

**Definitions:*

Anniversary Date: the date on which the domain name was registered in a previous year

Deletion: the .pharmacy domain name is officially deleted from the root zone.

Redemption Grace Period: the 30 day period after the Anniversary Date

Suspension: the .pharmacy domain name remains in the root zone, but does not resolve to the corresponding website

NABP reserves the right, in its sole discretion, to immediately suspend Registrant's .pharmacy domain or NABP's approval of Registrant's .pharmacy domain application if NABP obtains information indicating that Registrant is violating, or within the previous 12 months violated without disclosing to NABP, any criminal, fraud, pharmaceutical, pharmacy-related, patient safety-related, or Internet-related law or regulation or ICANN requirement, is engaging in abusive activities in connection with the Internet or its governance, threatens or its activities threaten the security or stability of the Internet or of the .pharmacy namespace, or Registrant is likely to cause direct and material harm to others. Registry Operator will notify Registrant and Registrar of the pending deletion. No refund will be issued for any registration fees, application or reapplication fees.

If Registrant is compliant with applicable law and ICANN requirements, but its activities, or lack thereof, indicate that Registrant is not compliant with the .pharmacy Registrant Eligibility Standards and the .pharmacy Authorized Usage Policy, Registry Operator will notify Registrar and Registrant of the pending domain name suspension, and the reason for the pending suspension. If Registrant does not timely cure the non-compliance, Registry Operator will notify Registrar and Registrant that the domain name has been deleted and returned to general availability. An additional thirty day Remediation Grace Period will not be given. No refund of the registration fee will be provided to Registrant if Registry Operator deletes the domain.

All communications regarding pending domain deletions are performed in writing. No hearing, whether in-person or otherwise, is permitted. There will be no right to an appeal of the Registry Operator decision.

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Exhibit E
Registration Fees

1. Domain-Name Initial Registration Fee and Maximum Resale Price

Registrar agrees to pay NABP in US currency the non-refundable amount set forth in the tables below, per annual increment of an initial domain name registration, or such other amount as may be established in accordance with Section 4 of the Agreement. Furthermore, Registrar agrees that the Registrants under the NABP Member Board’s \$0 Tier, will have a zero (\$0.00) registration fee. Registrar will not add any amount to the Registry Operator’s zero (\$0.00) registration fee. After the limited registration period, NABP’s member boards and other NABP designated Registrants in the \$0 Tier shall not be charged any registration fee and no mark-up or amounts may be added by the Registrar. Other than domains for the NABP Member Board and other NABP-designated Registrants, which shall be valid and in effect for a five (5) year period, Registrar shall register domain names to Registrants only for one (1) year periods according to Registry Operator policies.

Registrar will not charge an amount greater than the maximum total resale price for a domain in the applicable price tier, as set forth in the table below. Registrar retains the ability to charge any price below the maximum registrar fee for a domain in the applicable price tier.

* Applicable Domain Names in each Price Tier are available through the Registry Service Provider. Domain Names not in the \$0, \$2,500, \$10,000, \$12,500, \$15,000, or \$25,000 Tier, are in the \$750 Tier.

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2. Domain-Name Renewal Fee

Registrar agrees to pay NABP in U.S. currency; the non-refundable annual registration fee for a domain name registration renewal, or such other amount as may be established in accordance with Section 1 above. Registrar acknowledges that if the .pharmacy domain(s) is renewed and Registrant never submits a completed renewal application or Registry Operator, in its sole discretion, determines that the Registrant is not compliant with the .pharmacy Registrant Eligibility Standards and the .pharmacy Authorized Usage Policy, the domain(s) will be suspended and/or deleted and no refund will be issued to Registrar or Registrant.

Registrar shall accept and process payments for the renewal of a domain name by a URS Complainant, in cases where the URS Complainant prevailed, after the Registry Operator has verified the URS Complainant is in compliance with the .pharmacy Registrant Eligibility Standards and the .pharmacy Authorized Usage Policy.

3. Domain Name Transfer

Registrar is prohibited from accepting a transferred domain name without Registry Operator's prior written approval.

For a bulk transfer approved by ICANN, Registry Operator will charge the gaining registrar USD \$0 (for transfers of 50,000 names or fewer) or USD \$50,000 (for transfers of more than 50,000 names).

4. EPP Update to Restore a Name

Registrar agrees to pay USD \$750.00 per use of the EPP Update command to restore a domain name, after the Registry Operator assures that the Registrant is in compliance with the .pharmacy Registrant Eligibility Standards and the .pharmacy Authorized Usage Policy, or such other amount as may be established in accordance with Section 1 above.

Registry Operator may charge registrars the following maximum price for each Registered Name that is restored pursuant to the thirty (30) day Redemption Grace Period Policy set forth in the Registry Agreement.

The cost of restoring an unintentionally deleted domain name in the Redemption Grace Period must not exceed USD \$500.00.*

Registry Operator will waive the fee for restoring any Registered Name that was deleted, contrary to the wishes of the Registered Name Holder, as the result of a mistake of the Registry Operator.

* Note: the fee for restoring deleted names is separate from, and in addition to, any Renewal Fees that may be charged as set forth above.

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
