Announcement on changing of standard time for Greenland

At the 2022 autumn session, Greenland's parliament, Inatsisartut, passed a law on the determination of time in Greenland. The law stipulates, among other things, that Greenland's standard time is UTC -2 from 25 March 2023 onwards.

The law also empowers Greenland's government, Naalakkersuisut, to lay down regulations about Daylight Saving Time, and that specified areas in Greenland shall follow a different standard time than Greenland's standard time.

Greenland has for many years changed to Daylight Saving Time the same period as the European Union does. Greenland continues to do so. However, Greenland will not switch to Daylight Saving Time this year, 2023, because the standard time for Greenland will change from UTC -3 to UTC -2. However, Greenland will change to Daylight Saving Time again in 2024 and onwards.

There will thus be a shift in Greenland's regular timekeeping this year.

The areas Danmarkshavn and Pituffik (Thule Air Base) are exempt from the law, and set their own standard time and Daylight Saving Time. Moreover, it is not yet determent if the city of Ittoqqortoormiit will change to Greenland standard time as well.
